Bus Services

The number 54 bus takes a specified circular route through Churton Park to Wellington City.



Buses also travel from Johnsonville to Wellington, Tawa, Porirua, Newlands, Woodridge, Grenada, Johnsonville West and further north.

From Courtenay Place, Wellington City:

- On week-days check the timetable for exact times.
- On Saturdays, Buses run at 8.30 am, 9.30 am, 10 am and half hourly until 7 pm. Hourly between 7 pm and 11 pm.
- On Friday and Saturday nights, the last buses return from Courtenay Place at 11 pm (no midnight bus). Buses also return to Churton Park via Newlands at 1 am, 2 am and 3 am on Saturday morning and Sunday morning.
- On Sundays buses run hourly from 9.25 am until 10.25 pm.

The bus from Churton Park will also stop **on request** near the Cook Strait **ferry terminal** at Aotea Quay. Alternatively, a free shuttle transfers passengers between platform 9 at the railway station and the ferry terminal. The shuttle waits at platform 9 before each ferry sailing. To return to Churton Park from the ferry take the train to Johnsonville or bus **54** to Churton Park from platform D by the railway station.

Rubbish and Recycling Collection and Landfill

Rubbish Collection

Wellington City Council runs weekly rubbish collections. Only rubbish in official bags will be collected. Bags can be purchased at supermarkets, some dairies, or Council Service Centres. Bags must be placed on the roadside by 8 am each Monday.

Recycling

Wellington City Council collects recycled material every week on the same day as your rubbish. Recycled material includes: paper and cardboard (tie up in bundles or place in separate plastic bags; green, brown, blue, frosted and clear glass bottles (washed and without lids); all plastic containers numbered 1 to 3 on the bottom; all food tins/steel cans and aluminium cans (washed).

Material must be placed in official Wellington City Council green recycling bins on the roadside by 7 am each Monday.

Landfill (for large amounts of rubbish)

Located at the end of Broken Hill Road, Porirua.

Opening hours are:

8:30 am to 5 pm weekdays. Weekends and Statutory Holidays 9 am to 5 pm. Closed Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday and Easter Monday. Cost: \$7 per car, \$14-50 per car and trailer or van/utility.

Trash Palace

Located at the end of Broken Hill Road, Porirua. Drop off point for whiteware, household goods and scrap for free. Phone 237-6440 to pre-book a free collection from your home (some conditions apply).

Weather

Most properties enjoy all day sun but are exposed to the prevailing northerly winds. Most of Churton Park is sheltered from severe southerly conditions.

The summer to early autumn is the most settled period. In summer, expect a maximum temperature of 19-24° C. A typical winter maximum temperature is 10-14°C.

There are around 2000 hours of sunshine per year!

Rain falls at any time of the year, with summer being the driest season.

Some common New Zealand phrases:

“Bring a plate” is to bring a plate of food to a social event. Usually it means a plate of biscuits, cake or savouries. Ask what is expected if you are not sure.

“To shout someone” is to pay for the drinks/food/outing.

“Come to tea” or “come to dinner” means come to the evening meal (the main meal of the day).

“Come to morning tea” or “come to afternoon tea” means to come and have a cup of tea or coffee in the middle of the morning or the middle of the afternoon.
